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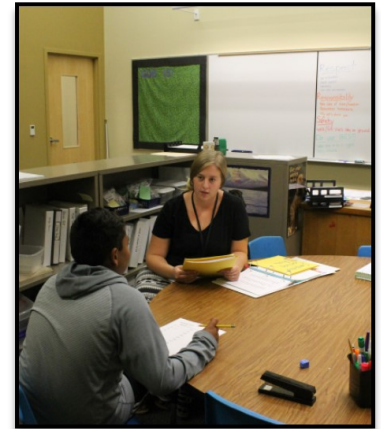

What Services Do We Offer?

When classroom support is not enough...

Dyslexic Program:

We use the Susan Barton Reading and Spelling Program. This is an Orton-Gillingham based curriculum that has been research proven as the most effective way to teach a dyslexic student how to read, write, and spell.

In addition to out-of-class support, students are trained with assistive technology to aid them in the classroom and with homework. The goal is to encourage students to be as independent and confident as possible.

*The Dyslexic Program is a three-five-year commitment depending on the student's level of need.

Math Support Program:

For students that qualify for math support, we offer small group specialized instruction.
