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**All tuition plan payments are managed thru FACTS Tuition Management** thru either direct debit from your bank account or an auto charge to your credit card with an additional 2.85% credit card processing fee. Please see FACTS annual fees associated with each plan.

#### Payment options are:

- Payment in full by May 1st you will receive a 2% discount on tuition. (FACTS annual fee \$25)
- Payment in full by August 1st (FACTS annual fee \$25)
- Semi-annually, two payments August 2023 and January 2024. (FACTS annual fee \$25)
- Payments may be paid monthly beginning in August for 10 or 12 months.
   (FACTS annual fee \$55)

### Withdrawal

Home School students, who determine a need to withdraw will be responsible for the full tuition for the next Quarter grading period (25% of annual assessed tuition) unless a withdrawal has been fully processed 30 days prior to the start of that term.

**Prior to the School Year Withdrawal:** Students must withdraw by August 1st for the current school year. Any student that is withdrawn after August 1st, will pay 25% of tuition.

**During the School Year Withdrawal:** Students must withdrawal 30 days prior to the end of the quarter grading period to not be assessed tuition for the following grading period. Example: 3rd Quarter ends on April 1st, student must be withdrawn by March 3rd or payment for the 4th quarter will be due.

To be considered withdrawn – Parent or legal guardian must give to the Business Office a completed INTENT TO WITHDRAW FORM.

### Interview:

Once all application documents have been submitted, Mrs. Wagley or Mrs. Stewart will contact you to schedule your family interview.

### **Tuition:**

The NWCS Homeschool Program is entirely funded by enrolled homeschool families. An updated fee schedule is available on our website. We offer a 25% discount for each additional enrolled sibling.

### **Enrollment:**

After receiving notification of acceptance, parents will be emailed the information to start and complete the enrollment process online.
